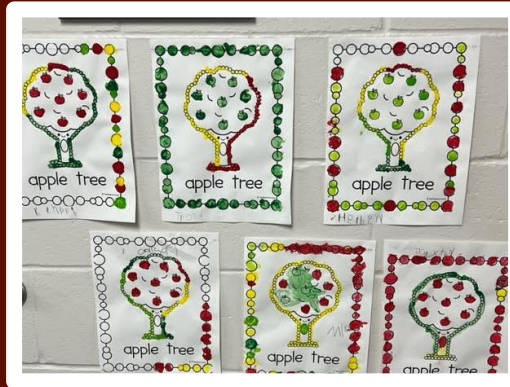
# Downsville Elementary School
